- Ask:**

 - What happened when they shared the good news with the whole city?

Say:

The world is longing for the truth that someone loves them and has the power to help them! As Christians, we have that truth, and we have to share with the world that God loves everyone and has the power to help us with whatever we face in life.

 - What can you do to share that Good News of Jesus with others?
