“I Don’t Get It, That’s Okay! I’m Gonna Obey Anyway!”



“So obey the commands of the Lord your God by walking in his ways and fearing him.” – Deuteronomy 8:6

This week, we continue our series called, “Elisha: God’s Powerful Prophet.” In this lesson, we learn that God is God - we are not. If we will trust and obey Him, there is no limit to what He can do in our lives.

Read:
2 Kings 5

Ask:

- What was the name of the army officer? From what did he suffer?
- What did Elisha tell Naaman to do? How did Naaman respond at first to Elisha’s instructions?
- What happened after the seventh dip in the river?

Say:

When God speaks, we should obey. It doesn’t matter if what He says makes sense to us. We are to obey simply because we are His children and He is our Heavenly Father. If we will obey no matter what, we will find ourselves in the same spot that Naaman found himself - on the other side of his miracle. God is not asking us to “earn” His power. He is asking us to trust Him and obey Him.

Ask/Discuss:

- Have you ever had a time that God spoke to you? Did it make sense?
- Have you ever disobeyed God but wish you had obeyed?
- When is a time you obeyed God? What came from your obedience? Was it worth it?

Pray:

Pray for your children to trust God no matter the difficulty. Pray that they will begin to trust God to come through in the toughest situations. Pray for them to obey God’s commands. Remind them that blessing follows obedience.
