THE TRACTORS:

This story comes from the far away land of Africa. A very poverty stricken part of Africa where thousands die yearly. It was an area that had fertile soil but they didn't have the equipment to farm the land and raise a crop that would feed the thousands of hungry people. What does a GREAT CHURCH look like?

1. A Great Commitment to the Great Commandment

Matthew 22:36-39- "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'

Christianity is a relationship with God the Father through His Son Jesus Christ.

If we are going to be a GREAT CHURCH our lives must be centered God's love for us and our love for God. I do what I do because I love God with all my heart soul mind and strength.

I believe we need a revival of love in our hearts.

2. A Great Commitment to the Great Commission

Mark 16:15- "And then he told them, "Go into all the world and preach the Good News to everyone."

<u>Matthew 28:18-20</u>- "Jesus came and told his disciples, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new

disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

This would imply that until the end of the age we need to have a great commitment to the great commission.

The only marching orders Jesus gave the church was to "Go into all the world and make disciples of all nations."

Let me say this, people who don't want their church to grow are telling the world, "you can go to hell."

I pray there will be a revival of the great commission in our hearts today.

If we are going to focus on what really matters most we must make a great commitment to the great commandment and a great commitment to the great commission.

Talk about them when you are at home and when you are on the road, when you are going to bed and when you are getting up. Tie them to your hands and wear them on your forehead as reminders."

The Holy Spirit corrected me this past week. Have you ever said these words, "I'm not called to work with children?"

Every one of us is called to work with children!

Mark 9:33-37- "After they arrived at Capernaum and settled in a house, Jesus asked his disciples, "What were you discussing out on the road?" But they didn't answer, because they had been arguing about which of them was the greatest. He sat down, called the twelve disciples over to him, and said, "Whoever wants to be first must take last place and be the servant of everyone else."

Then he put a little child among them. Taking the child in his arms, he said to them, "Anyone who welcomes a little child like this on my behalf welcomes me, and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not only me but also my Father who sent me."
